

PRACTICE TIPS

Why you shouldn't always start at the beginning of a piece

- Have you ever noticed how you always play your pieces better at the start compared to everywhere else? That's because if you always start at the beginning, you're practicing the part you know best the most instead of the parts that need the most practice.
- This is especially handy when you're performing in public. If you're comfortable with starting at different places in the music, you feel more secure and confident if you happen to make a mistake because you have developed several points of reference in the piece rather than having to go all the way back to the beginning.
- Choose a few different places that you can start. This helps balance the entire piece and ensures all sections are strong and secure.

 Natural places to start are where we've divided the piece as we're learning it. Start working on the newest portions first before going back to the beginning and playing the entire piece.
